ST. JOSEPH'S VILLA RECEIVES DONATION FROM RCM&D

Funds will be used to support programs for
children with intellectual and developmental disabilities

Richmond, VA – St. Joseph's Villa today announced that it had received a check for \$13,216 from insurance broker RCM&D to support the Villa's programs for children with intellectual and developmental disabilities. The funds are proceeds from the 17th Annual RCM&D Regatta, which was held in Baltimore, Maryland on September 17, 2011.

"We are thrilled with this support for our children," said Kathleen Burke Barrett, the Villa's Chief Executive Officer. "These funds will go a long way to enhance the after-school and weekend respite programs for some of the community's neediest children, children with profound intellectual and developmental disabilities."

The proceeds were delivered to the Villa by John "Mac" L. McElroy, III, Senior Vice President and Managing Director of RCM&D Virginia; James Shewey, Business Development at RCM&D and member of the SJV Development Committee; and Marissa Schott.

This year's Regatta raised more than \$51,000 for four charities: St. Joseph's Villa, NorthBay, The Marine Semper Fi Fund, and The League for People with Disabilities. The event has raised more than \$410,000 since its inception.

St. Joseph's Villa

Established in Richmond in 1834, St. Joseph's Villa is metro-Richmond, Virginia's oldest and largest continuously-operating children's nonprofit organization. The Villa is located on a spacious 82-acre campus in Richmond/Henrico County and builds stronger children, families and communities. The Villa serves more than 500 children and families daily, through the delivery of day, after-school and residential programs that include: special and nontraditional education programs for at-risk youth; education and housing services for homeless children and their families; education and respite, summer and after-school care for children with autism and developmental disabilities; behavioral treatment programs for children and families; housing for adults with disabilities; and a child development center. The Villa is accredited by the national Council on Accreditation and is an approved Medicaid provider for many of its services.

St. Joseph's Villa admits clients of any race, color, gender, age, religion, disability or national origin to all the rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accepted or made available to clients at St. Joseph's Villa.
